Andy Flatt to Step Down as Song Leader

His last regular Sunday is September 30th

Andy Flatt announced this past Sunday his intention to step down as our regular song leader—a position that he has held for nearly 17 years. In making the announcement Andy said, *“Effective the end of this month, I will be stepping down as your regular song leader. This decision was not made recently, quickly, nor without much prayer and consideration, and it is a decision that is not made because of anything negative. But given my other responsibilities in life and what I feel is a need for increasingly more time to be spent on worship planning, I have come to a realization that you deserve someone in this position who can be dedicated to a greater commitment.”*

Andy went on to say, *“My family has worshipped here for almost 21 years and appreciates everything you have done for us. I am personally grateful for the support and encouragement all of you have shown me. This is a great singing congregation; one that virtually leads itself. You have been kind to allow me a small part in directing you each week.”*

The Flatts have been a vital part of this congregation for over 21 years. They plan to continue to worship and be part of this family. Andy has agreed to be part of our transition/interim song leading team.

The elders, along with members of the staff and our worship planning team, have been working to develop an interim team to lead our singing beginning in October. They are in the process of developing a plan to use for the next three months.

On behalf of the elders and the entire congregation, we want to thank Andy for the fine job he has done in leading our singing. Later this month, on the 30th of September, he will lead our 5th Sunday singing and then take off a month before being part of our rotation in November.

Andy concluded his remarks by thanking individuals that have helped him through the years and the support he has received from the congregation, *“It is my hope that you will support new worship leadership and their mission of taking our worship services to new heights in the same kind manner in which you have blessed and supported me in that same endeavor. God has done great things at Brentwood Hills and has even greater things in store. I thank God and you for allowing me to play a small part for all of these years.”*

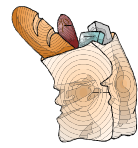

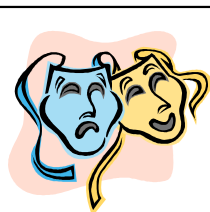

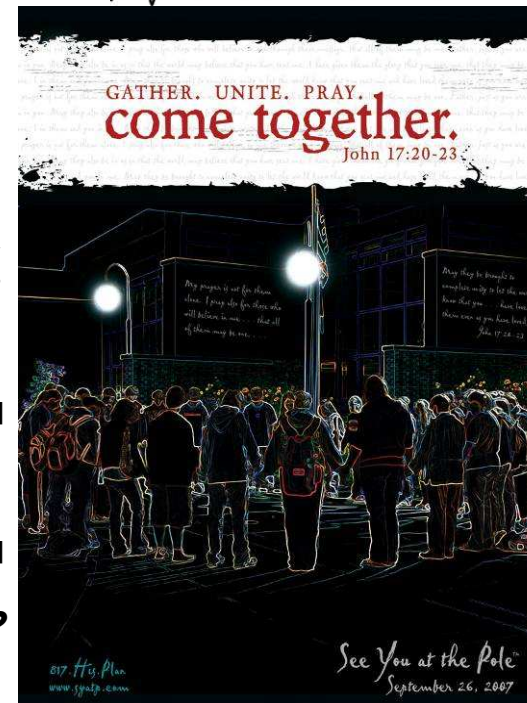


7th-12th Night in Nolensville—September 30th
