Bloemer - - "....Through setting up free clinics, we attended to the medical and dental needs of over 1,168 patients and gave out over 4,031 prescriptions in six different locations in and around Tegucigalpa. While seeing each patient, we shared the good news of salvation in Jesus with them and also offered to pray for any special needs



they might have. In each location that we set up a clinic, we also held VBS for the children where we taught them a number of different Bible lessons that went along with the theme Jesus el uno y unico (Jesus the One and Only), gave away toys and clothing, played soccer and other games with them, did crafts, and just held and loved on them. We also bought and delivered food packages consisting of basic necessities such as rice, beans, flour, oil, and sugar to over 100 families. These families were very poor. While we visited them in their homes, we held a devotional with them and let them know we were praying for them. We also visited and delivered needed personal articles, toys, and supplies to a nursing home, an orphanage, and a hospital. We donated our extra money to assist with the nutrition, Good Samaritan, compassion, and educational programs within the community. My very favorite part of the trip was adopting exceptionally poor children for an afternoon, taking them out to eat and playing with them." 


