A WORD FROM WALT

Sharing love ...

Last Sunday, as we continued to focus on our 2010 Vision statement - *Sharing light and love on our journey to the Son!* - the question was asked:

Is love a noun or a verb?

The answer of course is "Yes" - "love" is a noun, and "love" is a verb - depending on how it is used in the sentence or conversation. However, if our goal is to *share love*, and we are certainly commanded by Jesus to do so, we must recognize "love" as a verb - which *describes an action* (not necessarily a feeling) and which *happens intentionally* (not necessarily naturally or automatically).

On any and every Sunday (and every day) at Brentwood Hills there are countless examples of *love in action*, but there were at least two unique reminders this past Sunday:

White Bucket Collection!

Brent Terry, John Young, and others passionately reminded us of the horrific conditions in Haiti, and you responded generously by putting over \$41,000 in the White Buckets - over and above the \$49,422 that was also given in our regular contribution - a total for Sunday of more than \$90,422! It is such a blessing to be around folks like you whose compassionate hearts and confidence in God's promises prompt you to *share love* ... promises like this one:

... God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace about to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

II Corinthians 9:7-8

Sunday Night's Worship led by our Teens!

Every Sunday night is wonderful, but last week's was extra special. Our First Graders, who graduated that morning from Children's Worship, received their own Bible - a gift from Brentwood Hills and their parents - in a very memorable presentation.

Also, the entire service was led by our teens, and they did an excellent job. Everyone was especially encouraged and challenged by the interviews with six of our teens who are each involved in a different ministry - some of which they personally started - and each of which beautifully and powerfully *shares love* - serving nursing home residents, cutting and delivering firewood to Tent City, working with children from the inner city, ministering to their fellow teens, and raising awareness and funds for war-ravaged children in Uganda.

Our teens are taking seriously this command from Paul to Timothy:

Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity. 1 Timothy 4:12

It's inspiring to see teens who "get it" - they know *love is a verb* - and we can all benefit from their example!

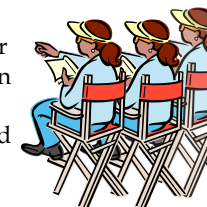
