

# A WORD FROM WALT

The Brentwood Hills Canteen?

In December, 1941, North Platte, Nebraska was a town of only 12,000 people and a hub for the Union Pacific Railroad.

Ten days after the attack on Pearl Harbor, residents of North Platte heard that a train load of troops from Nebraska's National Guard would be passing through, en route to the West Coast. As many as 500 local residents met the train with cookies, cakes and candy, but were initially disappointed to discover that the troops were from Kansas, not Nebraska. The story goes that one of the ladies in the group, Rae Wilson, announced, "I'm not taking my cookies home!" As a result, every soldier on the train received a lot of good food and priceless encouragement.

That experience became the catalyst for a touching story in American history that has significant implications for the Lord's Church today.

Beginning on Christmas Day, 1941, and continuing for more than four years, every soldier on a train passing through North Platte (more than 6 million of them) were greeted by volunteers who served sandwiches, coffee, cakes and other homemade treats, along with lots of love and support. Union Pacific gave their Depot Restaurant to the volunteers and it was renamed the **North Platte Canteen**. During World War II, a total of 55,000 volunteers from 125 towns joined the residents of North Platte to welcome, feed and entertain as many as 5,000 young soldiers a day - many of them homesick and filled with fear. These brief stops provided memories and encouragement that lasted for a lifetime.

Every day, and especially on Sundays, many "soldiers" of all ages come through the doors at Brentwood Hills. Their war is "not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." (Ephesians 6:12). Some of these soldiers are already in the Lord's Army and others may not yet be sure which flag they're following.

On any given day, many of them (including any of us from time to time) may be confused, tired, lonely, afraid or discouraged. However, just like the troops that passed through North Platte decades ago, those passing through Brentwood Hills today can richly benefit from spiritual nourishment, encouragement and lots of love and support. Is there anything our community, or any community, needs more than a spiritual version of the North Platte Canteen? God calls it the church! In fact, that's what He says is one of the primary reasons we meet together:

"Let us not give up meeting together ... but let us encourage one another..." (Hebrews 10:25)

#### JONATHAN'S JOURNEY

### ENCOUNTERING GOD THROUGH THE PSALMS-PSALMS 1 AND 70

From Lamar Bowman...(Psalm 1) In life, there are only two real choices. We choose God or we choose the world (Matthew 7:13-14). Psalm 1 focuses on this principle. This concept stands at the beginning of the entire collection. This hymn calls the worshiper to make this choice. It is a psalm of wisdom guiding the children of God to follow the path of righteousness. Choosing God means not following the path of sinners in all aspects of life. Choosing God means delighting in the Law or God's will and meditating on it day and night. The natural result of this is stability in life, like a tree constantly fed and growing strong, by a perpetual source of sustenance. This stability in life leads to prosperity, a prosperity that stems from understanding God's will and his Law, not a prosperity defined by the world. The foundation of blessedness is found in constantly struggling with the revealed will of God. A failure to study God's word then leads to wrong choices and spiritual poverty. The wicked perish in their choices, even if they prosper by worldly standards. The blessed know that joy and success rest in the covenant relationship God has offered to his people. We choose the path of the Lord because it is the path he has chosen for us and all that walk in it are known by him.

(Psalm 70) Bearing remarkable similarities to Psalm 40:13-17, this psalm reflects the anxiety of the worshiper in desperate times. The quick rhythm of the language in the request for help emphasizes the intensity of emotion expressed by the psalmist in his time of need. His desire is for God to hurry up and act. His predicament is worsening, and his enemies are intensifying their efforts to make him suffer. However, his cry is not one of complete despair. The psalmist knows God and that the Lord is his help and deliverer. It is not a matter of if God will help, but when. But even in light of this great statement of faith the psalmist's patience is challenged. His last cry reiterates the body of the psalm: "O Lord, do not delay". The Christian makes the same petition, but in the end, our cry should for the final act of God: Lord, come quickly (Revelation 22:12, 20; see also 1 Corinthians 16:22)!


