A WORD FROM WALT

In Case of Emergency

Who is the first person you call when facing a personal crisis? Obviously when we need emergency services we call 911. However, whether or not the crisis requires a 911 call, who is the "other" first person you call?

Ideally, wouldn't it be someone who ...

- already knows you personally and truly cares about you?
- has the wisdom, ability, and resources to genuinely help you in your crisis?

Nehemiah was facing a crisis. For several months his passion and his prayers had been focused on the desperate situation in Jerusalem, but he was 800 miles away serving as the cupbearer for the King of Persia.

One morning the king noticed something unusual about Nehemiah:

Why does your face look so sad when you are not ill? This can be nothing but sadness of heart. (Nehemiah 2:2)

Nehemiah was "very much afraid" because the king obviously had little patience with people in his presence who were not excited about being there. But his heart was breaking because of his kinsmen in Jerusalem, and he was no longer able to hide his pain.

Nehemiah's personal crisis was whether or not to share his burden with the king who had just inquired about his sadness. An unwise response had the potential of causing him to lose his job, maybe even his life.

Nehemiah had no cell phone, but he did have access to what some have called a "flare prayer," a quick cry to God in the midst of a pressure-packed situation.

Then I prayed to the God of heaven and I answered the king ... (Nehemiah 2:4-5)

God answered Nehemiah's "flare prayer" and opened an amazing door for his return to Jerusalem to rebuild the wall. However, that "flare prayer" was effective for two very important reasons:

- **Nehemiah was praying to someone he already knew extremely well.** We know from the first chapter of his book that for the past four months Nehemiah had been praying and fasting, which clearly indicates that he and God already had a close relationship. When you need help in a crisis you typically call someone you know, and Nehemiah certainly knew God. How well do we know God? It's so much better to get to know Him well BEFORE the crisis!

- **Nehemiah was praying to someone who was able to help.** In a crisis we may have people to call who know us and really care about us, but they don't have the ability or power to help. That's never the case with God. He can do anything and everything!

When praise becomes a conduit in our lives it becomes the first thought when we wake and the last as we drift asleep.
