A WORD FROM WALT

The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. – Psalm 19:1

Recently I went to a “star-gazing party” with one of my sons-in-law while on a family weekend at Cumberland Mountain State Park. At this “event” we looked at the heavens through several large telescopes set-up on a hillside by amateur astronomers. In addition to clearly seeing Jupiter and some of the craters on our Moon, we were invited to look through one of the telescopes to see a “nearby galaxy” – one that is outside our own Milky Way galaxy. I mentioned last Sunday night how mind-boggling it was to hear the owner of that telescope calmly tell us:

“Those stars are 2.3 million light years away.”

As we learned in school, light travels 186,000 miles per second – about 7 times around the earth in one second. A “light year” is the distance light travels in a year – 5.88 trillion miles (or so I am told). Therefore, that astronomer at the park was inviting us to gaze at starglight that “left” more than 2 million years ago, traveling 5.88 trillion miles each year non-stop, arriving here on a Friday night just two weeks ago.

Wow!

Louie Giglio, in his amazing DVD *Indescribable*, considers the question, “Why is the universe so big?” Of course some assume that the enormous magnitude of the universe indicates that there must be additional forms of life out there somewhere – that we could not be the only living creatures in this vast creation. Although it may be impossible to prove that assumption either way, Giglio suggests another possibility – that God created a universe so indescribably large and magnificent to tangibly remind those created in His image (you and me and everyone else) of how incredibly big and powerful our God is!

Think about it: If we are praying to the same God who holds billions and billions and billions and billions of stars in the palm of His hand, and has a name for each of them (Isaiah 40:26), don't you think He will be much more than adequate to deal with any problem we encounter?

This discussion continues tonight during our evening worship at 6 p.m.!

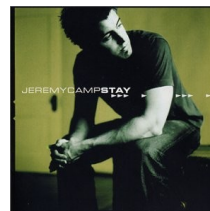

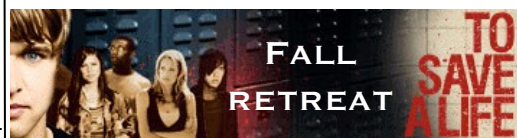
