She and her sister, Betsie, were in Barracks 28 at Ravensbruck, a Nazi Concentration Camp during World War II. They were two of 1,400 prisoners in a facility built to hold 400.</p> <p>Within minutes after entering Barracks 28 on their first day, Corrie cried: <i>Fleas! The place is swarming with them! How can we live in such a place?</i></p> <p>Her sister replied: <i>Corrie, He's given us the answer! Before we asked, as He always does!</i></p> <p>Earlier that very morning, at great risk to their own lives, these two sisters had read and now remembered these inspired words from I Thessalonians 5: <i>Comfort the frightened, help the weak, be patient with everyone. See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus.</i></p> <p>Betsie began to pray, and she thanked God for "every single thing about this new barracks!" She thanked God that she and her sister were assigned there together, and that they were not inspected when they came in and were able to keep a copy of the Bible, and for the crowded room with so many women whom they would have the opportunity to influence ... and "thank you for the fleas!"</p> <p>Betsie including a prayer of thanksgiving for the fleas pushed Corrie over the line: <i>"Betsie, there's no way even God can make me grateful for a flea."</i></p> <p><i>"Give thanks in all circumstances," Betsie quoted. "It doesn't say, 'in pleasant circumstances.' Fleas are part of this place where God has put us."</i></p> <p><i>And so we stood between tiers of bunks and gave thanks for fleas. But this time I was sure Betsie was wrong.</i></p> <p>The grueling days of hard labor were almost unbearable, but the nights in Barracks 28 took an unexpected turn. After a typical dinner of turnip soup, Corrie and Betsie went to the back of the large dormitory room to read their Bible and worship - secretly of course.</p> <p><i>At first Betsie and I called these meetings with great timidity. But as night after night went by and no guard ever came near us, we grew bolder. So many now wanted to join us that we held a second service after evening roll call.</i></p> <p>Guards were practically everywhere in Barracks 28, but there were almost never any guards in the large room where Corrie and Betsie lived - and where they worshipped - and these sisters did not understand why ... until the day when some of the women called for the supervisor to help them settle a disagreement, and neither the supervisor nor any of the guards would even step through the door into their dormitory room. <i>Why not?</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>The supervisor's reply, "That place is crawling with fleas!"</i></p> <p>Corrie remembered her sister's prayer of thanksgiving for the fleas that enabled them to worship every single night ... and now she understood! <i>Thank you for the fleas!</i></p>


