A WORD FROM WALT

Of all the amazing things associated with the life of Jesus, which one is the most difficult to believe?

- That Jesus could and would die on a cross, and that His death would enable the Almighty God to forgive our sins?
- That Jesus came back to life physically, just days after being publicly executed on the cross?
- That Jesus healed every type of disease and affliction and even brought dead people back to life?
- That Jesus performed a variety of other miracles, including calming storms, walking on water and feeding thousands of people with very small amounts of food?

J. I. Packer, in his book *Knowing God*, suggests an entirely different answer:

The supreme mystery with which the gospel confronts us is not in the Good Friday message of atonement, nor in the Easter message of resurrection, but in the Christmas message of incarnation. The really staggering Christian claim is that Jesus of Nazareth was God made man.

It is here, in the thing that happened at the first Christmas, that the profoundest and most unfathomable depths of the Christian revelation lie. "The Word was made flesh" (John 1:14); God became man; the divine Son became a Jew; the Almighty appeared on earth as a helpless human baby, unable to do more than lie and stare and wriggle and make noises, needing to be fed and changed and taught to talk like any other child. And there was no illusion or deception in this; the babyhood of the Son of God was a reality. The more you think about it, the more staggering it gets. Nothing in fiction is so fantastic as is this truth of the incarnation.

If Jesus had been no more than a very remarkable, godly man, the difficulties in believing what the New Testament tells us about his life and work would be truly mountainous. But if Jesus was the same person as the eternal Word ... it is no wonder if fresh acts of creative power marked his coming into this world, and his life in it, and his exit from it.

Though God's Word does not identify the day, the month or even the season of the year when Jesus was born, we know without a doubt that Jesus was born. The importance of that glorious fact to us and to the world is worthy of celebration on any day - and on every day - of the year!

UPDATE FROM THE WALKER FAMILY

Last week, Sara and Brian Walker were anticipating the birth of their daughter, Anna Elizabeth. However on Monday morning an ultrasound revealed that the heart had stopped beating and the family knew that she would be stillborn. Sara delivered Anna on Monday, December 6. Sara and Brian have shared part of their story in a recent email that they have given me permission to share with each of you:

Our sweet, perfect, beautiful baby girl, Anna Elizabeth Walker, was born on Monday evening. She was beautiful... We will likely never know what caused her death. I have chosen to believe that she was just too precious, too perfect, too sweet to be subjected to the imperfections, pains and disappointments that this life inevitably holds... We elected to just have a private memorial service at the hospital. Walt read from Scripture, offered words of comfort, and prayed for us. It was exactly what we wanted and needed.

Our hearts are full with love for her, and yet broken with the pain of missing her at the same time... Our hearts are broken for our little boys, who were so excited about having a little sister. We have explained to them that we will meet her someday, but that she is living in heaven now where God and Jesus are taking care of her. Praise God for the hope of heaven! Again, we have felt your love more than you know... Just keep praying for us and love us. That's what we need. We will welcome your calls, visits, and cards if you are so inclined, but know that we already feel your love! Sara and Brian

Brian told me Sunday that he felt God was preparing him to help others.
