A WORD FROM WALT

Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful. Joshua 1:8

Last Sunday night, David McMurtry's presentation of II Timothy inspired all of us. He certainly accomplished the goal of communicating Paul's final inspired message, but he also provided a memorable "living illustration" of the power of meditation.

As David was preparing for Sunday night, he told me that in addition to "memorizing" those four chapters, he was also "internalizing" them in order to feel more deeply what Paul was sharing. Those two words, *memorize and internalize*, are key to meditation - a spiritual discipline for which God promises priceless benefits (see Joshua 1 & Psalm 1). Whether it's just one verse, an entire chapter or even a complete book, how can we afford to miss the blessings God assures those who regularly and consistently meditate on His word?

David shared with me some of his personal thoughts about meditation, and he speaks from experience:

I have found that memorizing scripture helps to put the story the writer is telling straight into my heart, bypassing all the external clutter that tends to distract my attention. Memorizing the letters of Paul and Peter helps me to write their emotional words on my heart, where they belong, rather than just on my mind. I can then spend any available time I have meditating on the words of the author without needing to have the book in front of me. For me, it becomes an emotional exercise to get deep into their souls while they share God's impact on their lives with their audience. It is easy to daydream while reading from a book; it is impossible to daydream while considering something committed to memory as you tap into their heart and soul. Taking the eyes out of the equation allows the heart to experience the author's words without boundaries. The more I memorize the words of the apostles and write the words from their heart onto my own heart, the more powerful God's Word is in my life.

Blessed is the man ... his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.
