A WORD FROM WALT

"... with God all things are possible." Matthew 19:26

One of the reasons *Radical* is such a transforming book is that David Platt tells true stories about challenges Christians face in other parts of the world, and how those challenges are wonderfully met with God's power.

Here's another true story, one that happened earlier this month, involving people we know and love – Will and Shawna Tucker and their three children – taken from an e-mail written to some of their prayer warriors:

The Tuckers have been in Uganda for nearly four months waiting on their container, similar to a moving van, containing their furniture and appliances.

About a week ago, Will traveled from Mbarara to Kampala and on to Jinja, because he had been told to meet the truck on July 15 or 16, at the border town, Malaba, to clear Customs. He waited in Jinja for days and finally on Thursday, July 21, he was notified that the container was near the border. Then news came that the truck had broken down a mile from the border. He thought that might be a hoax to charge more money, but it was a legitimate break-down.

For weeks Will had been concerned that the border folks would try to extract a great deal of money to permit the container to come into Uganda. The highest amount was \$13,000, more than all of the contents are worth. Today, they reduced that to \$5,000. Then they began to hassle Will about the grocery store products on the container – soft drinks, diapers, shampoo, etc. – thinking that he was going to sell this stuff for a profit. He and his team mates (three families with eleven children) planned to use this stuff to live. These are things that are hard to purchase in Uganda.

Then, all of a sudden, they charged him \$700, a fair price for bringing a 30,000 pound container through Customs. And now, he is on his way to Mbarara and his family!

Our God is alive – and He is AWESOME!
