A WORD FROM WALT

What is impossible with man is possible with God!

These words of Jesus (Luke 18:27) are important and encouraging to remember when we feel it's impossible to successfully live the life to which God has called us. For example, I am probably not the only one reading this who can frequently relate to these transparent words from the Apostle Paul:

"For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out."
Romans 7:18

Let's remind ourselves again of times when Jesus told people to do things that were 'impossible'. For example:

"Come ..." Matthew 15:29

This is Jesus' command to Peter to walk on the water, in the middle of the night, in the middle of a storm, in the middle of the Sea of Galilee. Peter and his fellow apostles saw Jesus walking to them on the water, and Peter asked Jesus to *"tell me to come to you on the water."* Without hesitation Jesus told Peter to *"Come"* and he did - something that would have been **absolutely impossible - except for the fact that he was obeying Jesus.**

"Stretch out your hand." Luke 6:10

This is Jesus' command to a man with a shriveled right hand who was in a crowd listening to Jesus. To the onlookers Jesus' instructions could have seemed cruel and they may have thought, "You've embarrassed this man publicly by asking him to do something that anyone can see is impossible for him to do." Yet in a matter of moments the man stretched out his hand and *"was completely restored"* - something that would have been **absolutely impossible - except for the fact that he was obeying Jesus.**

"... get up, take your mat and go home." Mark 2:11

This is Jesus' command to a man who was paralyzed and had been brought to Jesus on a mat, through a hole in the roof, by four of his determined friends. Jesus first forgave the man's sins - his greatest need. However, to prove his Divinity to the onlookers, especially the skeptics, Jesus told the paralytic to *"... get up ..."* - something that would have been **absolutely impossible - except for the fact that he was obeying Jesus.**

What is impossible with man is possible with God!



COUNT DOWN UNTIL PROMOTION.....

Only **3 more weeks** until we mail the post cards to the children announcing their new teachers. There is lots to do to prepare for the new classes for the children.



Before we can mail the postcards or even distribute the curriculum we need to know who the teachers will be..... We have **29 classes** that need teachers for Sunday and Wednesday nights. Every classroom needs to have **2 adults** in class with the children. That is a **minimum of 116 adults.....** **The teaching commitment to teach for the school year does not mean that you have to be in class teaching every time the class meets.** The team approach creates flexibility for everyone and a sense of security for the children. There are lots of ways you can serve: as a couple with another team (could be a couple or 2 individuals) and alternate teaching either weekly or monthly; volunteer to be a teacher's helper and assist; be a substitute teacher (sign the separate list), or join a group that needs just one more individual teacher to create a teaching team.



Don't delay! We need your help serving our precious own children. **The chart is in the foyer under the banner.** Choose your class and sign the list to teach either Sunday mornings or Wednesday nights. **Perplexed about your options? Then sign the board with other options:** Willing to sub; Desire to be on a teaching team but need a partner; Would like to assist an experienced teacher. **We'll help you connect and use your talents.**
