A WORD FROM WALT

As was mentioned last Sunday, one of the most memorable moments related to "9/11/01" happened three days later, on Friday, September 14, 2001. It was certainly an unusual Friday: the stock market was closed, no planes were in the air, and all the college and pro games scheduled for a big football weekend had been canceled.

President Bush had declared that Friday, Sept. 14, 2001, be a "Day of Prayer and Remembrance," and he and his wife were on the front row of the National Cathedral for a globally telecast prayer service. They weren't alone. The cathedral was filled with former presidents, members of the cabinet, congress, the Supreme Court and many others.

As the world watched, songs were sung, scriptures were read, and there were comments from the President. Then the service took a "politically incorrect" turn as Billy Graham addressed the audience:

Here in this majestic National Cathedral we see all around us symbols of the Cross. The Cross tells us that God understands our sin and our suffering ... for He took upon Himself, in the person of Jesus Christ, our sins and our suffering. From the Cross God declares, "I love you. I know the heartaches and the sorrow and the pain that you feel, but I love you."

We need a spiritual revival in America ... and God has told us in His word – time after time – that we are to repent of our sins and return to Him, and He will bless us in a new way. Yes, our nation has been attacked, buildings destroyed, lives lost. But now we have a choice:

Whether to implode and disintegrate, emotionally and spiritually, as a people and a nation ...

Or whether we choose to become stronger through all of this struggle – to rebuild on a solid foundation. That foundation is our trust in God, and that's what this service is all about. And in that faith we have the strength to endure something as difficult and horrendous as what we've experienced this week.

My prayer today is that we will feel the loving arms of wrapped around us – and will know in our hearts that He will never forsake us as we trust in Him.

The humbled attitude of our nation and the bold words of Billy Graham – ten years ago this week – remind me of two seemingly unrelated statements:

*"There are no atheists in foxholes."
"As long as there are tests, there will be prayer in schools."*
